

Total confirmed Islamic State affiliates in Iraq and Syria


Total confirmed Islamic State affiliates returned to country of departure






Proportions of women and minor returnees

Official recorded proportion of infants born in Iraq and Syria to foreign parent(s)






Sample of countries with notable proportions of women and minor returnees*
